

The Logan County Farmers Market wants to ensure the health and safety of vendors and customers during this tenuous time. As a result, the following is implemented effective as of April 9, 2020:

LCFM Operations:

- The Logan County Farmers Market will operate as a pre-order and curbside pick-up/delivery market effective upon launch (April 25) and until further notice.
- Customers will place an order online during a specified window of time (Sunday-Wednesday @ 6:00pm) and will shop at the market with one transaction.
- Customers will pre-pay for their online order and choose Curbside Pick-up or Delivery to obtain their purchased items.
- Customers who participate in Incentives Programs will choose Curbside Pick-Up option only and our Incentives Coordinator Lisa will process the transaction at the vehicle.
- Sale of food is limited to whole, uncut produce and packaged food items. No on-site food preparation will be allowed.
- All ready-to-eat foods must be pre-packaged before arriving at market.
- No sampling of any food is permitted.
- All extracurricular activities including music, children's activities, cooking demos, etc. will be postponed and rescheduled until next reevaluation by the Board of Directors.

Sick Policy:

- Sick employees, volunteers and vendors must stay home and not return until they are free of fever for at least 72 hours without fever-reducing medication and improvement in respiratory symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath) and, at least 7 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.
- Those who appear to be ill upon arrival to market or become sick during the day should be sent home immediately.
- Take the temperature of all employees, volunteers and vendors upon arrival, confirming that no person has a temperature of more than 100.4°F [38° C]. If an employee, volunteer or vendor should register a temperature of 100.4°F [38° C], he/she/they will be sent home immediately.
- Customers must stay home and not return until they are free of fever for at least 72 hours without fever-reducing medication and improvement in

respiratory symptoms (e.g., cough, shortness of breath) and, at least 7 days have passed since symptoms first appeared.

LCFM Policy:

- Market Manager and limited volunteers will apply frequent handwashing practices before and after vendor drop-off, product redistribution, and customer pick up.
- Market Manager, Incentives Coordinator, and volunteers, wear gloves when appropriate, regardless of whether or not they handle food.
- Market Manager and limited volunteers will redistribute vendor products on behalf of customers so that items are gathered by order and ready for easy pick-up.
- One Person will handle food and another person to handle payment transactions when possible.
- Vendors will clean hands frequently, ideally before and after preparation and drop off.
- Vendors will drop off pre-ordered, pre-packaged items to Drop Off point on Saturday mornings during designated time frame, with LCFM limited staff/volunteers unloading product for vendors and carrying into redistribution space.
